So I took her to the um vet and um hers definitely looked like a different form of cancer. And hers looks mostly like something from the sun and sh- which is true she always loves to lie in the sun so. Yeah, so for her she had surgery about two weeks ago so she's due to take out her staples and it looks good so far it looks like it healed really well um her insitions was a lot more bigger than what his was cause he had, she had more spots in multiple places rather than his where it was one big one on his side. So it was different forms of cancer but they both had cancer- um has cancer and the doctor wasn't exactly sure what is was- what it was from but hers was I think it was a skin cancer.
