






What is Title I?

Title I is a program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children.

A Title I, Part A program is to provide all children with a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. (ESEA section 1001)



Title I Eligibility

Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) Title I eligibility is based on a minimum poverty threshold of 47.2%, which is determined by the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced-priced meals.





Requirements for a Title I School

- Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA) must be conducted at each Title I school in order to gain a better understanding of the strengths and the contributing/root causes of the identified needs.
- Title I Schoolwide Plan must be written, implemented and monitored by each school. It describes how the school will improve academic achievement by addressing contributing causes of needs identified in the school's CNA. Within the HIDOE, the school's Three-Year Academic Plan (AcPlan) is considered to be the Title I Schoolwide Plan.
- Fiscal Requirements Form (FRF), the school's Title I budget plan, must be aligned to the school's CNA and the Title I Schoolwide Plan (AcPlan).
- Parent and Family Engagement activities are to improve student academic achievement and school performance.

Parent Rights

- · Ask for meetings and trainings.
- Review the results of annual parent involvement effectiveness survey.
- · Review the school's achievement data.
- Review the parent involvement plan.
- Review and have input into the Title I Parent Involvement Policy and Home/School Compact.





Parent Involvement

Parents are encouraged to be involved in their child's school!

Parents can be involved at Wai'anae High School through the School Community Council (SCC). The SCC provides parents with an opportunity to be involved in the academic program of the school. The SSC develops, monitors, and evaluates the Title 1 plan to implement programs and services that support students.

Title 1 Funds for Wai'anae High School provide:

- Teacher positions to provide smaller classes and individualized help
- Substitutes and stipends are used to provide teachers with professional development
- Subscription fees for online programs such as MasteryConnect, Peardeck, and MyOn to support differentiation and student achievement





Title 1 Wai'anae High School Funds Continued

- High Education costs and fees to support students succeeding post-high school such as:
 - AP (Advanced Placement) Exam fees
 - Early College Registration fees
- Technology such as chromebooks and tech supplies so that all students can access an authentic education either in the classroom or remotely
